- My guy! What's going on with you?
- Not much over here! Just hanging.
- Chilling out, doing nothing, how about you?
- NM! HBU?
- What's going down!!!
- Hello, hello! Sup?

- Hanging out! What about you, darling?
- What's up on your end?
- Nada, nada! WSG with you?
- What's Gooooood!
- NM, NM, NM!

What does “WSG” Mean?

Basically, if a friend or person says “WSG” it means, “What’s Good?” It’s another way of saying what’s up! For example, if you text your friend and ask them how their day is going—it’s pretty similar to saying, “What’s up on your end?”

The type of response the person is looking for is something that refers to what your day is involved with. Or what you’re focused on. You can easily just share what you’re currently doing or what you plan to do with your day/week.

In short, it’s like someone asking:

- What are you doing?
- What are you up to?
- How is your day going?
